Winds of Change Discussion Questions

Can you share a time when you felt truly scared or overwhelmed? How did you react, and what did you learn about yourself in that moment?

Have you ever felt God calling you into an unknown or uncomfortable situation? How did you respond, and what was the outcome?

Joshua 1:6-9 emphasizes being strong and courageous. What does "being strong and courageous" mean in your current season of life?

How do you currently define "success" and "prosperity"? How does this align (or not align) with what God might desire for your life?

In the sermon, it was mentioned that discerning God's will requires being in community. How has your community helped you discern God's will in your life? Have you ever struggled with feeling unqualified or like an imposter in a role or calling? How did you find encouragement to move forward?

When have you found yourself getting comfortable in a temporary situation, only to realize God was moving you toward something else? What was that like?

The sermon encourages us to name our greatest fears. What are some fears that hold you back, and how can naming them help you move forward?

The sermon reminds us that "if God called you to it, He'll see you through it." How has this truth played out in your life or the lives of others you know?

How do you create space in your life to hear God's promptings and the Holy Spirit's guidance? What has helped you grow in this area?

These questions aim to encourage vulnerability and faith-filled discussions while helping participants relate the sermon to their own journeys.
