YELLOW BRICK ROAD DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Reflecting on the Past: The Hebrew word Qedem means "looking back to move forward." Can you think of a time when reflecting on your past helped you make a better decision for your future?
- Patterns in Our Journey: In Genesis 12 and 20, Abraham repeats the same mistake by lying about Sarah. Why do you think we sometimes fall into the same patterns of sin or fear, even after experiencing God's faithfulness?
- God's Mercy in Our Mistakes: How do these passages reveal God's mercy, even when Abraham fails? How have you seen God's mercy in your own past failures?
- Fear vs. Faith: Abraham lied because he feared for his life. When have you let fear dictate your actions instead of faith? What would it look like to trust God in those moments?
- The Impact of Our Choices: Abraham's deception affected not just himself but also Sarah and Abimelech's household. How do our personal choices—good or bad—impact others around us?
- God's Intervention: In Genesis 20, God intervenes in Abimelech's life to prevent sin. Have you ever experienced a moment where you felt God redirected you away from a harmful decision?
- Healing and Restoration: Despite Abraham's mistakes, God still blesses and restores him. What does this tell us about God's character? How does this encourage you in your own struggles?
- Personal Reflection: If you could go back and give advice to your younger self based on what you know now, what would you say? How might that advice help someone else today?
- Moving Forward: What is one practical step you can take this week to learn from your past without being trapped by it? How can we support and encourage each other in this?
