- When have multiple people remembered the same event very differently? How did that make you feel?
- Read Luke 1:1-4 together. What stands out about how Luke describes his writing process?
- Think of a significant event in your life. How might different people who were there tell that story? What value would all those perspectives have?
- When you read different Gospel accounts of the same event, do the differences bother you or do you see value in them?
- When you read the Bible, are you looking more for facts/information or for connection with God? Why?
- The Gospels record different final words of Jesus on the cross. Would you rather have an exact transcript or multiple perspectives that reveal who Jesus is? Why?
- Share a time when Scripture changed your thinking or behavior, even without knowing every historical detail.
- Where do you fall on this spectrum: Need every detail historically precise / Comfortable with multiple perspectives conveying truth / Somewhere in between?
- God could have communicated any way He wanted but chose human authors.
 What does this tell us about God's character?
- Based on today's discussion, what would you like prayer for regarding your relationship with Scripture?
